CAPA's wish is that no child will ever have to know what it is like to experience abuse. But until that day comes, our doors are open to provide individual and family counseling to children and their families who have experienced family trauma, abuse, or neglect.

We believe no family should have to face this challenge alone.

Children and individuals are given a voice through an array of trauma-focused therapies including art and play therapy so they can tell their story and begin to heal.



CAPA understands that parenting is hard even in the very best of circumstances, and sometimes parents need a helping hand.

Our Healthy Families Jackson County™ home-visiting program aims to reduce the risk factors that could lead to adverse childhood experiences, such as child abuse and neglect. Our caring case managers work closely with the families to help promote family resiliency and healthy parenting skills. Through this program, families are connected to additional social and tangible resources and supports while increasing their knowledge of age-appropriate expectations for their children.



Prevention Education Services
