Message from President and CEO *Rochelle Parker*



I want to sincerely thank you for all your support in 2020! It was one of the most challenging years this generation has seen, and you were there every step of the way to make sure we had what we needed to support the families we serve.

Within a short time frame, we transitioned all our counseling, case management, and prevention education services to a virtual platform. This was something we had never done!

With this new way of engaging, we continued to enroll families at a high rate and even provided additional support to combat the trauma they experienced due to racial, political, and economic unrest throughout the nation. We accomplished so much together last year, and I just want to share a glimpse with you:

- All enrolled families were given gift cards to purchase food, baby supplies, and other necessities and offered a family fun night basket for the holidays to foster connection.
- All families in our home visiting program continued to receive diapers through Happy Bottoms.
- We celebrated one year at our second location in the Blue Ridge Tower.
- We hired two new therapists of color to support the needs of our communities of color.
- Staff and interns completed an impactful diversity, equity, and inclusion training.
- Staff and interns were equipped with work equipment and furniture to work remotely from home.
- Both CAPA offices adhered to strict COVID-19 guidelines and we had only one reported positive case.
- We celebrated job title changes and promotions to accompany our growth.
- We had a clean financial audit and successful funder site visits.
- We welcomed new board members to the family.

CAPA's wish is that no child will ever have to know what it is like to experience abuse. Until that day comes, CAPA is here to provide individual and family counseling to children and their families who have experienced family trauma, abuse, or neglect. Children and individuals are given a voice through an array of trauma-focused therapies including art and play therapy so they can tell their story and begin to heal.

We believe no family should have to face this challenge alone. With the emergence of COVID-19 in 2020, CAPA quickly responded by developing virtual and telehealth counseling options so that children and families continued to have access to support during a time when they needed it the most.



CAPA understands that parenting is hard even in the very best of circumstances, and sometimes parents need a helping hand.

Our Healthy Families Jackson County[™] home-visiting program aims to reduce the risk factors that could lead to adverse childhood experiences, such as child abuse and neglect. With the emergence of COVID-19 early in the year, the program successfully pivoted to deliver critical services virtually. Our caring Family Support Specialists continue to work closely with pregnant and new parents to help promote family resiliency and healthy parenting skills. Through this program, families are connected to additional resources and supports while increasing their knowledge of age-appropriate expectations for their children.
